




China has been subject to foreign domination for most of its history since the invasion of the Mongols in 1271.

Chinese have ruled China only 276 years since 1271 until the People's Republic of China was established in 1949.


The Chinese have an ancient civilization more than four thousands years old, but they have a new nation not yet 70 years old.

## Silk Roads



Silk Roads are a network of routes extending 4,000 miles to transport Chinese silks, perfumes, spices, jewels, and even slaves. They served for more than 2,000 years, beginning during the Han Dynasty (206 BCE-220 CE) as a significant conduit for the spread of knowledge, and the development of the great civilizations of China, India, Educate Porcia, Arabia, and Roma.







Took Sun's place in 1925
Led Northern Expedition
to unify China
Engaged in civil war with the
Chinese Communist Party
Massacred 12,000 in Shanghai
in 1927
CCP defeated Nationalists who
retreated to Taiwan
President of the Republic of
China until his death in 1975





## CHINESE TRADE AGREEMENTS WITH LATIN AMERICA

China is seen as a less onerous alternative to the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund, for energy, resources, infrastructure, communications; expand Chinese access to copper, iron ore, China overtakes US as Number 1 trading partner.

**Argentina** \$10 B China Development Bank loan

Brazil \$15 B steel, electricity, communications networks

China is the largest foreign direct investor in Brazil
